## CHANGING PROGRAMS

---

### How do I request a program change?

---

Meet with an Academic Advisor to request a program change. We can help you determine how many courses you would have left to complete if you change programs, and when you would be able to graduate. We can also help you with any questions you may have about university programs and pre-requisites related to your new program.

### What is the deadline for requesting a program change?

---

The deadline to request a program change is November 1<sup>st</sup> in the fall semester and March 1<sup>st</sup> in the winter semester. Please note, however, that we will accept requests for the following changes at any time before the beginning of the following semester: from Science into Commerce, from any program into Social Science, and from a Double-DEC into a single DEC.

### Is it possible to switch into any program I want?

---

No. Admission to a new program is competitive and will depend on your academic performance in college, your high school grades, whether you have the appropriate pre-requisite courses, and the spaces available in the program. A switch into the Music program requires that you complete an audition as well. Please note that it is not possible to switch into Arts & Science or into Liberal Arts from another program.

### Am I guaranteed my program change request?

---

No. Approval for the program change will depend on available space and on your academic performance.

### How will I know if my request was granted?

---

You will receive a confirmation of your program change via MIO after the program change request deadline.

### What if the program I want is not available at Marianopolis?

---

If you want to study in a program that is not available at Marianopolis, you must apply to one or more colleges that do offer program(s) that interest you. The deadline to apply to Quebec colleges is March 1<sup>st</sup> for the fall semester and November 1<sup>st</sup> for the winter semester. Note that not all programs start in the winter semester.
