In order to register for summer school, see an Academic Advisor in person (A-269):

If you fail a course in the Winter 2019 semester, contact an Academic Advisor as soon as your grade is posted in Omnivox in order to register for the failed course(s). You cannot register until the failing grade is posted.

Marianopolis students who wish to take a course at another college:

After the other college has posted its summer school schedule, see an Academic Advisor to obtain a *commandite* (permission to take a course at another college). Consult the registration and fee payment information of the college offering the course.

If you are an international student or a non-Quebec resident and you want to obtain a *commandite*, you must first pay the international/non-resident fees to Marianopolis. Please see an Academic Advisor for details.

STUDENTS FROM OTHER COLLEGES

- Obtain a *commandite* (permission to take a course at another college) from an Academic Advisor at your college.
- Email advising@marianopolis.edu and attach your *commandite*. You will receive an email with the date and time of your registration appointment.

STUDENT EVALUATION AND CONDUCT

You are expected to attend all classes. After the drop deadline, you must confirm your registration and attendance. Standards of behaviour as outlined in the [Student Code of Conduct](#) and the [Institutional Policy on the Evaluation of Student Achievement](#) are expected.

NUMBER OF COURSES

You may take a maximum of 2 summer courses, including courses you take at other colleges.

FEE PER COURSE

- If you do not pay in full by the deadline listed above, you will be de-registered
- Cash payments: exact amount only (A-203A)
- Cheques: payable to Marianopolis College and not post-dated (A-203A)
- Online: add Marianopolis College as a payee and pay via online banking with your financial institution

COURSE DROPS AND REFUNDS

In order to drop a course, you must see an Academic Advisor in person (A-269) to complete a Course Drop Form by 4 p.m. no later than the deadline listed (see "Drop deadline" column on next page).

Refunds are calculated as follows:

- If you drop a course before the first day of class, you will receive a full refund minus the \$30 registration fee.
- If you drop a course on the first day of classes or any time until the drop deadline, you will receive a prorated refund minus the \$30 registration fee.

There are no refunds after the drop deadline.
