SERVICES PROVIDED TO SURVIVORS OF CRIMINAL ACTS

In accordance with the Act to Prevent and Fight Sexual Violence in Higher Education Institutions (CQLR, c. P-22.1), Marianopolis College adopted a Sexual Violence Policy, which aims to:

- reflect a College-wide stance against sexual violence;
- prevent and reduce the risk of sexual violence by educating and raising awareness among Marianopolis community members about its nature and effects;
- provide options, support, resources and accommodations to survivors of sexual violence regardless of where or when the sexual violence occurred;
- guarantee timely and coordinated responses to disclosures and reports of sexual violence.

The College provides the following services to students or employees who are survivors of sexual violence or sexual offences under the Criminal Code of Canada:

- on-campus resource person who is a registered social worker and who provides a safe, confidential space for disclosures, facilitates access to support services and accommodations, and informs the survivor of their rights and options;
- information about the status of an internal investigation following a report of sexual violence, the follow-up given to the report, the imposition or not of a sanction, as well as the details and terms thereof, if applicable.

OUR COMMITMENT

Marianopolis is committed to fostering an environment where all members of its community feel respected, safe and free from sexual violence. Through the Sexual Violence Policy, the College affirms a zero-tolerance stance on sexual violence. The College recognizes the critical

importance of proactive, accessible and effective approaches that prohibit, prevent and respond to sexual violence.

COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE

In accordance with the Act to Support Persons who are Victims of Criminal Offences and to Promote their Recovery (CQLR, c. P-9.2.1), survivors of sexual violence can submit a complaint if they are dissatisfied after receiving the services described above, within 20 working days.

The complaint must be submitted in writing and must include the complainant's full name, telephone number, email address, and a detailed explanation as to why the complainant is dissatisfied with the services they received.

The complainant will receive a written response informing them of the outcome of their complaint within 40 working days.
