

# Summer Courses 2023

## General information

- **COURSE DATES:** All summer courses are taught in person and **begin on May 30**. Courses take place every weekday except June 23 and June 30. The final exam date is included in the dates listed.
- **MAXIMUM COURSES:** You may take a maximum of **two** summer courses.
- **UNPAID TUITION:** You may not register if you have an outstanding tuition balance.
- **COURSES AT ANOTHER COLLEGE:** You may be given authorization to register for a course at another college **only if** Marianopolis does not offer a course that you need this summer to graduate or in order to proceed with your courses in the fall. Please MIO an Academic Advisor if you are in this situation.
- **COURSE CANCELLATIONS:** Courses are subject to change or cancellation without prior notice.

## Registration for Marianopolis students

### If you are graduating this summer:

- Registration: March 30 and 31, 10:00 – 2:00, room A-269
- Payment deadline: April 7; through online banking

### If you are returning in the fall and you are behind by one or more courses in your progression (e.g. due to failure, dropped courses, incompletes, reduced course load):

- Registration: April 3 and 4, 10:00 – 2:00, room A-269
- Payment deadline: April 11; through online banking

### If you fail a course in the Winter 2023 semester:

- When you receive your final grade, you may register with an Academic Advisor during regular drop-in hours. The last day to register is May 29, 2:00, in room A-269.
- Payment deadline: Payment must be made the day you register, through online banking

### If you are not behind by any courses but you want to get ahead in your progression, registration is permitted where space allows:

- Registration: May 29, 4:00 – 5:00, room A-269
- Payment deadline: Payment must be made the day you register, through online banking

## Registration for students from other colleges

### If you are graduating this summer:

- An Academic Advisor at your college must send a commandite form by May 26.
- You will receive an email on May 29 by 4:00 to inform you whether you have been registered in the course. The payment deadline is May 29, through online banking.

## Payment instructions

If you do not pay by the deadline stated above, your course(s) will be dropped. Pay through **online banking**: add “Marianopolis College” as a payee and use your permanent code as your account number.

## Course drops

You may send a MIO to an Academic Advisor to request a course drop until 4 pm on the day of the drop deadline (see table that follows). **There are no course drops after 4pm on the day of the drop deadline.**

## Refunds

If you drop a course before the first day of class, you will receive a full refund minus the \$35 registration fee. If you drop a course on the first day of class or any time until the drop deadline, you will receive a prorated refund minus the \$35 registration fee. **There are no refunds after 4pm on the day of the drop deadline.**
